Dedicated to ending the cycle of violence, InterAct is saving lives, rebuilding lives, and securing safer futures for victims and survivors and their families.

InterAct has three 24-hour crisis lines, emergency shelter, court advocacy, electronic filing for Domestic Violence Order of Protection on site, 14 on-going support groups for adult and children, bilingual counseling, Solace Center-Wake County's first and only community based sexual assault forensic examination center, professional training, and a full violence prevention curriculum in the Wake County schools.
